**Travel Fees** - For in-person programs, a travel fee might be charged to schools located outside metropolitan areas to cover any additional travel and accommodation costs incurred by presenters, in addition to the program fee.

**Minimum Fees** - Programs can be provided for less than the minimum number of students, however the minimum fee will still apply. Larry Brandy is an Aboriginal storyteller with thirty years of experience. He has an engaging and interactive style incorporating movement, history and artefacts. He introduces students to his Wiradjuri culture with a focus on the significance of family, the environment and everyday life. This program can be adjusted to three hours for a more in depth experience.

## Kinder Dreamtime with Larry Brandy

Larry Brandy is an Aboriginal storyteller of thirty years of experience. In this program tailored to younger students he introduces his Wiradjuri culture. Masks and artefacts are shown to the children to explain how Aboriginal people hunted in traditional times. Students learn a dance with clapsticks and boomerangs and dance in a small Corroboree.

## Kinder Dreamtime with Keeden Blow

In this interactive program Keeden will give students an insight into his Aboriginal heritage and culture. He begins by demonstrating the Didgeridoo and explaining its origin and true name. He will tell stories of the Dreaming with content adjusted for a younger age group, teach sit-down dances which illustrate how stories are presented through movement and introduce symbolic art to demonstrate how stories are presented visually. Each of these activities can be extended to suit your classroom.

## Shorat Tursun Trio, Sound of Multicultural Australia

The Shohrat Tursun Trio is a dynamic combination of ancient Uyghur melodies and African chants and rhythms woven into contemporary compositions that could only have been forged in Australia. The multi-lingual ensemble is a vision of this country's future musical horizons. Be inspired by the sound of multicultural Australia! Shohrat Tursun – Vocals, Dutar (two string Lute) Yaw Derkyi – African percussion and vocals Richard Petkovic - Guitar, mandolin, harmonium & vocals.

Azadoota's front man Robin Zirwanda comes from Iraq, where the Assyrians trace their ancestors back 7000 years. Recognised throughout the diaspora as a goodwill ambassador for his little-known nation, Robin sings catchy originals in his native Assyrian Aramaic language. Azadoota's goal is to break down stereotypes and promote tolerance and harmony. Azadoota means "Freedom".

#### German / Dance

#### **Tirol Dancing**

Join Rowan for an incredible performance of high energy, intricate Bavarian folk dances. He will demonstrate various German and Austrian traditional and folk dances such as the Waltz, Polka and Zwiefacher. #### Chinese Martial Arts

A high energy workshop where presenters will discuss the history and philosophy of martial arts in China and demonstrate different styles of Kung-Fu and Tai-Chi. This workshop can be adapted to different ages and physical abilities. For larger groups or demonstrations our presenters can organise a live Chinese drumming accompaniment.

#### Chinese Dance and Arts

Experience a mix of Chinese arts in one program. Lively, interactive and educational this program can be tailored to any age group and ability. Students will gain insight into cultural practices such as national folk dance and music, Northern Lion Dance and Martial Arts. These performances provide an insight into the ancient world of Chinese culture, through their vivid display of colour, music and creativity.

#### Chinese Lion Dance

Students will learn about the history and symbolism of the Lion Dance, an art form that dates back to the 12th century. It is believed to bring good fortune, prosperity and longevity. As well as gaining an insight into ancient Chinese culture, students will love seeing the lion close up and learn how it is operated.

Bukhchuluun Ganburged (Bukhu) is a master student of the Music and Dance Conservatory of Ulaanbaatar in Mongolia and a powerful cultural ambassador for Mongolia. In this unique program he weaves storytelling with the music of the Morin Khuur (Horse Head Fiddle) and Khuumii (harmonic throat singing). Bukhu layers contemporary compositions and techniques with Mongolian folk musics and stories to create a special experience not to be missed.

Music, dance and the visual arts form the foundation of traditional Balinese life and will engage students in the life and history of this unique island culture. The interactive program includes activities such as a dance workshop, Angklung (bamboo instrument) playing and Kecak (vocal percussion).

Aiko brings to life Japanese culture with this beautifully crafted program. She teaches children about Japanese culture, traditions, seasons and celebrations through the use of puppets, songs, games and storytelling. This is an active and engaging program that will have students learning words and numbers in Japanese and, most importantly, having lots of fun.



#### **Early Years Chinese Dance**

This program engages students with an incredible performance of folk dances from across China such as the Lantern Dance, Ribbon Dance or Kung-Fu based Fan Dance. Students will practice a short routine using some of the moves they've seen, performed to both traditional and contemporary Chinese music. This is a program that can be tailored and enjoyed year after year.

#### **Classical Indian Dance**

Dance is an ancient part of Indian devotional and ceremonial life throughout many regions, created to entertain gods and goddesses. It is also intrisically related to both Bollywood and Yoga. After an amazing performance set to the sound of classical instruments and Sanskrit chants, students will learn some of the symbolic hand gestures mudras and how they tell stories of India's mythological past.
